## Awards for ASIS Chapters or Organizations

### Chapter Matching Scholarships

**Apply: January 2-November 21, 2014 (Awards are made available to the first 30 chapters annually.)**  
These scholarships support ASIS chapters by providing matching funds for an education award to a chapter member or undergraduate or graduate student seeking a security career.

### Roy Bordes Physical Security Award

**Apply: January 14-March 11, 2014**  
This chapter award provides up to \$5,000 for one chapter to receive a two-day, locally delivered, customized physical security program.

### **\*Chapter Website of the Year**

**Apply: Applications are due to the RVP by February 1, 2014**  
One chapter within each award group is recognized annually for its website. The Awards Committee reviews sites six times between July and December and presents winners \$300 and honorable mentions \$150.

### Matthew Simeone ASIS Award for Public/Private Excellence

**Apply: April 21-May 20, 2014**  
*Sponsored by the ASIS Law Enforcement Liaison Council (LELC)*  
This award, established in 2011, recognizes outstanding achievement by members of an ASIS chapter in public/private cooperation for public safety. Presented at the Annual Seminar and Exhibits; travel and hotel expenses for winners will be provided.

### **Certification Award of Organizational Merit**

**Apply: Applications are due by June 1, 2014**  
This award was established to recognize organizations that have demonstrated a significant commitment to the advancement of ASIS board certification. Winners are formally recognized at the Annual Seminar and Exhibits.

**\*Note:** Awards marked with an asterisk participate in seven different awards groupings based on membership numbers on January 1 of the competition year—see Chapter Award Groupings in the Region & Chapter Resource Section

### **\*Community Service Award**

**Apply: Applications are due to your RVP by July 1, 2014**  
Winning ASIS chapters are recognized for their outstanding achievements in their local community. One winner is awarded per award group and receives \$1,000 donation from ASIS to a charity of the winner's choice.

### **\*Chapter Newsletter of the Year**

**Apply: Applications are due to the RVP by July 1, 2014**  
One chapter within each award group is recognized annually for its newsletter. The winning chapter receives \$300 and honorable mentions receive \$150.

### **\*I.B. Hale Chapter of the Year**

**Apply: Applications are due to the RVP by July 1, 2014**  
Annually, one chapter within each award group is recognized for excellence. A winning chapter receives \$600 and chapters awarded honorable mentions receive \$300.

## Awards for ASIS Members or Students

### Alan J. Cross Award

**Apply: January 2, 2014 (Awards are made available to the first 20 eligible applicants annually.)**  
This award pays registration fees for 20 members to attend an ASIS certification review course of their choice—computer-based or classroom.

### University of Phoenix Scholarship

**Apply: February 4-April 1, 2014**  
The University of Phoenix awards multiple full-tuition scholarships to ASIS members. Each scholarship enables a prospective student the opportunity to complete an undergraduate or master's degree program through the College of Criminal Justice and Security at University of Phoenix.

### The Charles H. "Sandy" Davidson IV Memorial Scholarship Webster-ASIS Foundation Scholarships

**Apply: March 4 to May 6, 2014**  
Webster University awards two (2) full-tuition scholarships to two ASIS members to complete a graduate degree in Business and Organizational Security Management.

### Military Liaison Council Certification Scholarship

**Apply: May 13-June 24, 2014**  
*Sponsored by the ASIS Military Liaison Council (MLC)*  
Established in 2012, this award provides an opportunity for ASIS members who actively serve in military service to pursue ASIS board certification. Scholarships cover the expenses of application, preparation (online review), and testing for the CPP, PCI, or PSP credential.

### **Certification Award – Regional**

**Apply: Applications are due by June 1, 2014**  
Individuals who have made a significant contribution to the advancement of ASIS board certification are recognized with this award. Winners are formally recognized at the Annual Seminar and Exhibits.

### **Criscuoli Volunteer of the Year Award**

**Apply: Applications are due to ASIS by July 1, 2014**  
An outstanding volunteer who has served at either the chapter or regional level within the ASIS community is honored with this award. The winner receives a free registration and travel expenses to attend the Annual Seminar and Exhibits.

### Timothy J. Walsh APC I Award

**Apply: September 2-October 1, 2014**  
One member is selected to receive this award, which pays the tuition, transportation, and hotel costs for a member to attend an ASIS Assets Protection Course™: Principles of Security (APC I).

### Student Writing Competition

**Apply: September 3-December 15, 2014**  
This annual competition rewards students who conduct research, engage in thoughtful deliberation, and write an academic paper on an issue relevant to the security and assets protection profession.

### **Don Walker Award for Enterprise Security Executive Leadership**

**Apply: Applications are due to ASIS by October 1, 2014**  
This award recognizes a senior security practitioner who demonstrates a commitment to security management standards, education, and certification within an organization.
